THE INTERNATIONAL HOMŒOPATHIC DIRECTORY  
AND THE INDIAN HOMŒOPATHY.

Perhaps our colleagues in India are aware of the fact that the Ninth Quinquennial Homœopathie Congress was held in London in July, 1927. It was decided in the Congress that an International Homœo. Directory should be published and the American Institute of Homœopathy was entrusted with the task of the publication. Dr. E. P. Hoyle, M. D. was appointed the Chairman of the Committee. Dr. Hoyle wrote to Drs. Sarat Ch. Ghose, J. N. Ghose and S. K. Nag separately to meet together and to supply him with reliable Indian data to be published in the Directory. But unfortunately we did not and could not meet together. After prolonged correspondence it was decided by Dr. Hoyle to place the Indian matter exclusively in our hands. Accordingly I had to labour hard and to spend a lot of money for the collection of all available information. But as many cross complaints reached Dr. Hoyle, the Directory committee did not publish the Indian matter in their Directory. It was no doubt, a slur upon the good name of Homœopathy in India. Had there been an unity amongst the homœopaths of our country and had the homœopaths of Calcutta been animated by an *esprit de Corps*, we would never have met with this rebuff and refusal. We did not sleep over this refusal and we were now pleased to inform our readers that Dr. Hoyle has now come forward to publish the Indian data in the Directory and a supplementary part will be issued by him. We have been entrusted with the task and our decision would be final. We, therefore, entreat all homœopaths, pharmacists, authors, organisers of homœopathie dispensaries and Schools and Colleges to supply Dr. S. C. Ghose, M. D. Editor-in-Chief of our Journal with all possible informations relating to this matter.
