MERCURIUS SOL. vs EYE SPECIALIST.

As a physician to the Regular and Central Homœo. College Outdoor Dispensary, I had the good fortune of displaying another wonder in Homœopathy by curing a student of the College named Maulvi Naderazaman, aged about 37 years,
