

# Carcinocin in Renal Failure

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**O**ne of the most common causes of renal hypertension in young individuals is post-streptococcal proliferating glomerulonephritis. Typically, a patient first develops streptococcal tonsillitis. The patient presents with edema and hypertension. Urine examination will show, albuminuria and hematuria. I have been observing in my practice that the cases of post streptococcal nephritis are on the rise. In my opinion, one of the causes of the rise in the incidence may be excessive consumption of chilled alcoholic beverages and soft drinks, which make an individual susceptible to *B. Haemolytica* streptococcal sore throat or tonsillitis. The infection is easily

transmitted in community gatherings like marriages, clubs, discotheques, etc. I found carcinocin as one of the most useful drugs in the treatment of most of my young patients who were suffering from renal failure due to hypertension.

#### *CASE (1) :*

A five year old female child was seen by me on 9.4.96 with signs of renal failure and was being treated by renal dialysis, twice a week since two months. The history revealed that her complaints started one year ago with puffiness of face and scanty urine. The child was initially treated as a case of hypertension and was later diagnosed as a case of renal parenchy-

mal disease after renal biopsy.

History of past illness revealed that the child had an abscess on right thigh and was treated with antibiotics and surgical excision. During the treatment, however, the child developed purpuric patches. Despite her severe illness, the child was cool and composed. When I enquired about her well being, she said "O.K." This prompted me to prescribe Arnica. The remedy was further justified by the presence of purpuric patches.

Arnica - 30, single dose, diluted in water, given one hourly for two days. The child responded very well, her swelling reduced, urine output increased and creatinine level decreased. There after,

she didn't require dialysis. In one week's time, she became active and playful.

The second prescription was Carcinisin - 30, single dose in three divided doses for three nights. The child showed remarkable improvement. By the end of second week, she started feeling pain at the same point from where the old abscess was drained. The child was subsequently prescribed Belladonna and Calcarea Carb according to the symptoms. And almost three weeks are over and the child is improving.

*CASE (2):*

A twenty two year old known case of renal failure was brought to me for treatment. On examination, he was found to be severely anaemic, pale and depressed. The patient complained of cramps in the calf muscles while walking and said that he could eat solid food with some liquid only. There was darkening around the eyes and freckles on the face. The patient had difficulty in breathing, and used to sigh. His symptoms used to aggravate with movements and from exposure to cold.

Personal history of the patient revealed that he was a drug addict and occasional indulgence in homosexuality. The patient had an emotional trauma when his fiance deserted him. He was em-

ployed in the petroleum industry where he had his first symptom of headache, for which he was treated.

Subsequently, he was diagnosed a case of hypertension. Soon, the patient developed signs of renal failure. His mother offered her kidney but he refused. The patient laughed as he revealed his personal history.

I prescribed Ignatia - 200, two doses, one morning and one evening, on following rubrics.

1. Grief due to disappointment in love.
2. Despair about his recovery.
3. Sympathetic towards parents.
4. Laughs on serious matters.

We showed some improvement but a remarkable one after a dose of Carcinisin, given in the second week. In between, the patient was given Eel serum in material doses.

*CASE (3):*

My third case is a lady, 30 years with history of Chronic hypertension followed by Kidney failure. Sonographic examination revealed bilateral smaller kidneys with a cyst in right ovary and in right kidney. Her uterus was enlarged with multiple fibroids. She was a known case of renal failure due to chronic renal disease. Her

serum creatinine was moderately high despite weekly renal dialysis.

Her suffering started with bleeding from nose which was found to be due to high blood pressure. The other symptoms were vomiting during menstruation, dysmenorrhoea and occasional constipation. She was a divorcee. She was tall, well built, jovial with decent behaviour. She wished to marry after she was cured.

I prescribed phosphorus 200, single dose, followed by Carcinisin after one month with remarkable improvement. In three months, the lady showed a remarkable improvement in every respect. There is no need of dialysis now. There were many other cases of renal hypertension who responded to Carcinisin. In one of my recent cases, Carcinisin reduced blood urea and serum creatinine from 395 mg% to 300 and 18.5, respectively, in twenty four hours.

I prescribe Carcinisin on the basis of the personality as a whole. The description of a typical personality which will respond to Carcinisin is as follows. The patient is soft spoken, amicable, honest, creative, impulsive and sanguine. Basically, he is not a cunning or crooked person. People with such a personality usually have a positive history of hypertension, diabetes, T.B. and Cancer in the family.

## **A REPORT ON DERMA 97, MADRAS, ORGANISED BY TAMILNADU HOMOEOPATHIC ASSOCIATION**

The homoeopathic Seminar Derma '97 was inaugurated by the Chief Guest DR. LALITHA KAMESHWARAN, Member, Tamilnadu State Planning Commission, former Vice Chancellor, Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, at Saveria Hotel, Madras. She compared Homoeopathy with all other systems of medicine and said no system is inferior, every system has got its own advantages. And she appreciated the advantages of homoeopathy.

The first scientific session started at 9.30. a.m. under the Chairmanship of DR. B.D. PATEL, Former Principal of GOVT. Homoeopathic Medical College, Bangalore. DR. SUGANTHI from Erode presented a paper on allergic Rhinitis and Eczema. DR. JOICE THILAGAM from Madras presented a case of Dermographism, cured with Platina 1M. Only on mental picture not considering any of the clinical signs & symptoms. The Session concluded with a detailed approach in tackling allergic disorders by DR. B.D. PATEL. And he said allergic comes and goes by Allah Ki marzi, So it is called allergy. The Session was lively conducted.

Session two on psoriasis

was presented by DR. ISMAIL SAIT, Professor of Trivendram College, DR. SARASHWATHY, presented a few cases of acute prescription for psoriasis. DR. HASAN spoke on psoriasis proper and Chairman DR. ISMAIL SAIT, Presented a few cases treated constitutionally.

Third Session on Pigmentary Disorders was presented by DR. MOHAMED ALLEM, from Madras and DR. GNANA SAMBANDAM Presented several cases of lip Vitiligo with Merc, Sol, Borax. DR. ALLEEM Spoke on Vitiligo proper.

Fourth session was infection chaired by DR. V.C. VYDHILINGAL from Thirumangalam College. DR. BALAJI Presented slides of all the infections of the skin. DR. KAMAL NAZAR presented few cases of skin infections treated on mental symptoms. DR. V.C. VYDHILINGAM discussed on various topics. He insisted on constitutional approach in skin disorders.

The Fifth session was chaired by DR. VELAYUTHAM from Erode, Chairman of the Seminar in which DR. N. SUBRAMANIAN from Salem

presented a beautiful paper on neoplasam. He discussed that neoplasam to which homoeopathy has got an answer from corns to cancer. He showed some cases of papilloma referred by Apollo Hospital and K.K.R. research institute which be cured totally. He also cured several cases of Papilloma throat with Thuja.

The last Session was cosmetology, Chairman being Mrs. VASUNDARA. DR. P. MUKUNTHAN and DR. M. RANJINI from Erode presented several cases of Acle Vulgaris, Blemishes and Alopecia being treated homoeopathically which the Cosmetologist appreciated very well.

The seminar in general had concentrated well on the disease proper. Except few papers others concentrated solely on the clinical features of diseases. I feel some more stress should have been laid on the homoeopathic approach rather than disease proper.
