

gave in the 30th potency—2 doses on the 14th December 1930. Mr..... De, aged about 42 years came under my treatment in the Regular and Central Homœo. College Out-door Dept., on the 19th October 1930 for his Tonsilitis and Pharyngitis from which he was suffering since 1910.

The main source of his trouble was that in case he was exposed to anykind of cold he would catch cold at once and tickling in the throat was most troublesome. During the period he had all along been using paints locally with amelioration for the time being without any real cure. It has now become his almost daily business to paint the throat.

Being disgusted with these paints now and then he decided to try homœopathy being given to understand by one of his friends that those sorts of local applications to the throat might lead to the growth of cancerous affections in the long run!

I took down the case as usual and present the same to the reader:

Mr. De was of short stature, medium size and was a little bulky. He was very peevish, oversensitive and a little bit nervous. On enquiry I was given to understand that he usually found fault with others at trifles and was very stubborn, so much so that he must do what he thought best. He was a chilly patient all through—would like to be covered up warmly. He did not use to take his regular bath for fear of catching cold and would not go out insufficiently covered. The prominent symptoms for which he was very much anxious was "tickling in the throat" and sensation of something in the throat which he could not explain. The glands near about would swell on slightest exposure and gave untold troubles. This was all I could gather from him. I then examined the local condition of the throat carefully and found nothing wrong there.

Before administration of the proper remedy, I had in my mind's eye, one thing to which I drew his particular attention and that was he would not be allowed to apply these paints etc. by any means, if he wanted permanent and real cure.

On a promise to that effect I prescribed a single dose of Hep. Sulph. 200th on the same day with instruction for a report after a week, "No more tickling and no more paintings. Thank God". I also said "No more medicines too!!"

After a fortnight a slight return of tickling led me to prescribe H. S. 500 2 globules in 1 oz. of distilled water. By the administration of this potency he is now less susceptible to cold and can walk in cold air with less fear and taking his regular bath cautiously. He has discarded local applications once for all, and by the grace of Almighty is allright.

It may be noted here that his mental conditions viz., oversensitiveness, peevishness etc., though less to a great degree has not yet altogether gone and I hope to try a dose of 1M. of his constitutional remedy after a lapse of some 3 or 4 months. I think, God willing, I shall succeed. May God help me.
