

his right ear. Though the left ear was apparently left unaffected, it also lost the normal power of hearing,—probably in sympathy with the affected ear. Save and except the said occasional discharges with slight internal pain, the affected organs had no other guiding symptoms for the selection of a remedy. This paucity of symptoms in the affected organs and the troublesome psoric affection of the boy in his childhood, were additional reasons why Sulphur was selected in the present case.

A POST-OPERATION CASE OF APENDICULAR ABSCESS.

On 9. 9. 29, I got a very interesting case of a boy named Sreeman Arobindo Banerjee (17) of Dhanbad E. I. Ry. The history of the case was that he suffered from habitual constipation. One day he was laid up with fever which lasted for a week after which he took rice diet. That day evening fever returned attended with great pain in appendicular region. Local doctors treated him for sometime but to no effect. Hence the father of the boy brought him over to Calcutta. Doctors of this city declared the case to be an appendicular abscess and advised early operation which took place in due course. Incision 7 inches long. By ill-luck the case got septic. Fever did not abate, ranging from 100° to 102°. At the centre of the incision a cavity was formed which gave off thin yellowish pus in a profuse quantity. Pus came out from his anus as well which soiled bed sheet. This state continued for 32 days when the Surgeon wanted to re-operate to see what was wrong within.

The boy became weak and thin so he feared he would not stand a 2nd. operation. He piteously requested his father not to comply with the wishes of the Surgeon and so the father was put out of his wits. In such a pass, one of his friends

suggested to him to try Homœopathic treatment. When he agreed to, I was called in. I gathered the following details:

After 3 or 4 days it was an *Ekadasi* day—and the temperature showed a rise up to 100° which made me anxious indeed. But I continued the S. L. which I assured the father would set every thing right.

The sinus cavity closed and by the 15th day of my treatment the boy recouped strength so I asked the father to take away his son.

Doctors were overheard to discuss among themselves that the boy would die within a week hence they insisted on a second operation.

But by the grace of immortal Hahnemann—he was brought to life. Mr. Banerjee writes to me very often stating the health of his almost lost son. Blessed be Hahnemann who introduced the art of saving life.
