DR. GILES FORWARD GOLDSBROUGH.

It is a melancholy duty on our part to announce the death of Dr. G. F. Goldsbrough. In the death of Dr. Goldsbrough the British Homœopathic Society has sustained a heavy loss and his demise has caused a gap which cannot be easily filled up. His death took place on Friday, 13 March, 1933. Dr. Goldsbrough graduated with honours as, M. B ; C. M., at the University of Aberdeen in 1877 and took his M. D. in 1881. He joined the British Homœo. Society in 1881 and tried his level best for its improvement in various ways. He served in the London Homœo. Hospital in various capacities. He was the Consulting Physician in the Hospital for diseases of the Nervous System. His works and labours in the Hospital were of a high order—he was very methodical, though very conscientious there.

He along with Dr. T. G. Stonham, M. D., edited the British Homœopathic Journal till the end of 1931 with conspicuous ability when both of them resigned to give place to younger men. He was Honyman-Gillespie Lecturer for the session 1914-15. He was a Fellow of the British Homœo. Society, was on the Council of the Society in 1897-98 and again in 1901. He was Vice-President in 1893 and 1894 and President in 1895.

After my election as a Corresponding Member of the British Homœo. Society in place of late Dr. M. L. Sircar M. D., in 1904, I had been in regular correspondence with him since that time and had been always impressed with his sincerity and high-mindedness. Dr. Goldsbrough was a veritable ogre for work. He was never half-hearted in anything he did, wrote or said. Whatever work he

addressed himself to, he poured forth upon it the whole strength of his virile soul. Earnestness was his outstanding characteristic and he was the very embodiment of the spirit of devotion.

Dr. Goldsbrough fulfilled the mission of his life. Let us not grow down-hearted or dejected for his death, but let us run the race to the end. In the words of the poet, let us

“Fill up the blanks in our files,
Strengthen the wavering line,
‘Stablish, continue our march,
On to the bound of waste,
On to the City of God.”
