ADVENT OF HOMOEOPATHY: Gastro Intestinal Disorders.
Vol 22/Jan - March 2005.

This quarterly journal on health, homoeopathy and allied subjects, is a very informative journal. It comprises of scientific papers, cases, letters to editors, news and views and new features like Materia Medica, Repertory, Pioneer of Homoeopathy with photographs and Advent of Homoeopathy Book Club.

This issue has been predominantly devoted to gastro-intestinal disorders like Irritable Bowel Syndrome, Traveller's Diarrhea, Gastro-enteritis, Gastritis, Peptic Ulcer, Piles, Flatulence etc. written by many renowned writers. They have presented the topics with illustrative cases and follow ups. There is also an article on Quick prescribing in GIT problems Therapeutics.

The Remedy – *Bellis-perennis* has been discussed in great detail by Dr S Tanvir. He mentions that *Bellis-perennis* is characterized by feelings of deep tumor in the affected area. In its psychology, one finds bruised and some emotions to such extent that a painful and hard spot has developed in the deep recesses of the patient's feelings. The patient will never reveal this to those around him, presenting instead a happy face. In this context it is interesting to consider Dr Clarke's apt comment on this remedy – the daisy is a flower which is repeatedly trodden upon and always comes up swirling afterwards.

Ailments from – Blows, fall, injuries, accidents, overwork, surgical operation etc, and its relationship with remedies like *Arnica*, *Rhustox* and others.

This issue also gives an interview with-Dr Praful Vijaykar by Dr S S Vithal, in which he mentions—that our 250 years old homoeopathic medicines are still

stands, which speaks the Scientificness of our Medical science, where as other sciences are still struggling to find out a drug which can cure an allergy or common cold in real sense.

Other things covered are—a very interesting story of our Father of Homoeopathy Dr Samuel Hahnemann, Role of Bowel Nosodes on Gastroenteritis, chicken pox and related remedies and Book Reviews.

A very interesting case of Muscular Dystrophy By Dr V Krishnamurthy who has logically quoted how he selected the remedy—*Plumbum*—which cured the patient with a single dose.

The author has very nicely brought out the hidden intangible fears within version of patients, which lead and help us in interpreting and converting them into rubrics of *Aconite*: Like fright, afraid, apprehension, terror, turmoil, dread horror, panic, bogey, consternation, phobia, awe etc.

the article *Aconite*: Singularly by team work:

1) Delirium death talks about
When the anxiety and fear overcast a patient overwhelmingly, patient gets delirious and feels that all the processes will come to an end, starts talking of death. Delirium raging, raving alternating with consciousness when somebody tries to expose his weakness or tries to give sarcastic comments he gets extremely angry, but next moment he feels like there was nothing, for which he became so angry, things could have managed without being so.

2) Delusions, animals of sheep driving:
Patient has the feel that his problem is like a sheep, which is very meek, imaginative animal, can be controlled easily. When patients get assured by his Physician then he feels that his problem is not severe, it would be controlled easily.

3) Fear bed go out of, or fear bed turn in to:
When the patient get assurance then even if he doesn’t get amelioration, he doesn’t want to turn in the bed, because of the fear that problem may increase.

4) Foolish behavior fever during:
During fever, the patient becomes very obstinate. If he asks for something it should be given without any delay. Keeps on tossing during fever. It appears very strange because generally the patient is very affectionate. This issue is one more addition to our homoeopathic armamentarium.
